

WILDFLOWER SCAVENGER HUNT

at the Fulling Mill Waterfall

Please protect the wildflowers: **stay on trail, be careful not to step on plants and never, ever pick a wildflower.**



Wild Blue Phlox
(*Phlox divaricata*)

Masses of low-growing, cheery purple flowers



Sessile Trillium
(*Trillium sessile*)

Often only a few inches high with three mottled leaves and a dark red flower



Violets
(*Viola spp.*)

This one is called striped white violet, but there are lots of different kinds of violets on the trail—blue, white, and yellow! How many can you find?



Large-flowered Bellwort
(*Uvularia grandiflora*)

With pale, flowers and drooping leaves, bellwort always looks a little wilted and unhappy.

Jacob's Ladder
(*Polemonium reptans*)



About 1 ft tall, with ladder-like compound leaves and soft bluish/lavender flowers with 5 petals

Shooting Star
(*Dodecatheon meadia*)



A cluster of descending flowers on a tall stalk above a large rosette of leaves



Yellow Trout Lily
(*Erythronium americanum*)

Trout lilies form massive colonies of beautiful mottled leaves, but many never flower.



Dutchman's Breeches
(*Dicentra cucullaria*)

Fine, feathery foliage with flowers that resemble upside-down pantaloons.



Celandine Poppy
(*Stylophorum diphyllum*)

Perhaps our sunniest wildflower, with four orangey-yellow petals.



Wild Ginger
(*Asarum canadense*)

Look for low-growing heart-shaped leaves to find wild ginger, then gently check at the bases of paired hearts to find the tiny flower, often resting beneath leaf litter.
